

## Streamlined and Strengthened: ACCJC Launches New Tools and Resources



#### **Interactive Data Dashboards and ROI Metric**

ACCJC recently launched its <u>Student Achievement Dashboards</u> and <u>Return on Investment</u> (<u>ROI) Metric</u>, key tools that reflect the Commission's ongoing commitment to transparency and institutional improvement. These public-facing dashboards enable students, policymakers, and institutional leaders to explore historical trends in student outcomes across all ACCJC member institutions, providing a clearer picture of educational value and impact.

#### **New Accreditation Platform and Portals**

After a multi-year development effort, the ACCJC Accreditation Platform is now fully deployed. The platform features dedicated portals for staff, commissioners, peer reviewers, and member institutions, each designed to streamline communication and simplify accreditation processes. The launch of the Institutional Portal marked the final step in this initiative, completing a comprehensive upgrade to how ACCJC supports its members and volunteers.

## ACCJC Receives \$400K Grant from College Futures Foundation to Advance Transparency, Storytelling, and Social Mobility

ACCJC has <u>received an additional \$400,000 grant from the College Futures Foundation</u> to deepen its work around data transparency, institutional storytelling, and the social mobility fostered by ACCJC-accredited colleges. The funding will support the expansion of the Transparency, Storytelling, and Value Literacy Project through the 2025–2026 academic year.

As part of this effort, ACCJC will host four regional convenings focused on elevating institutional strategies for understanding return on investment (ROI) at the programmatic level, as well as data transparency and student engagement. Each convening will feature Southwest Wisconsin Technical College, winner of the 2025 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, leading a workshop on program-level ROI.

## **ACCJC Showcases Workforce Partnerships Driving Student Success**

<u>Bylaws</u> and the <u>Policy on Representation of Accredited Status</u>. ACCJC's <u>updated logo</u> and the <u>ACCJC Logo Use and Style Guide</u> are available to assist with these updates.

Background: Since 2024, ACCJC has been doing business as "Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges". As such, the reference to Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) should be removed from statements of accredited status.

ACCJC is proud to be a strong advocate for two-year institutions and their students. Over the past year, President Powell has served as Vice Chair of the Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions (C-RAC), traveling frequently to Washington, D.C., to engage with Congress, higher education committees, and federal officials. These efforts ensure that the perspectives and needs of ACCJC member institutions are heard at the highest levels.

Recent advocacy efforts have focused on navigating the rapidly changing federal landscape, the valuable partnership between accreditors and their members,

and amplifying the voice of two-year institutions in national and regional conversations about data-transparency, workforce partnerships, and the value of higher education. By sharing data, best practices, and institutional stories, ACCJC ensures that the impact of its member institutions is recognized at the local, state, and national levels.



We are also deeply committed to increasing our capacity to deliver educational programming and resources by seeking funding and strategic partnerships with organizations such as College Futures Foundation and Lumina Foundation and have recently secured an additional \$400,000 grant from College Futures Foundation to expand our Transparency, Storytelling, and Value Literacy Project.

### **Advocating for Students Through Innovation**

The Council of Regional Accrediting Commissions (C-RAC) recently released a statement encouraging the responsible use of artificial intelligence (AI) to advance learning evaluation and recognition. The statement affirms that using AI for learning evaluation does not conflict with accreditation standards and emphasizes the importance of transparent, ethical deployment of AI tools. By leveraging AI thoughtfully, institutions can reduce unnecessary credit loss for students and strengthen pathways toward degree completion.

We begin with Mount Tamalpais College, whose groundbreaking work inside San Quentin Rehabilitation Center reflects the innovation, resilience, and dedication found throughout our membership.

Mount Tamalpais College, the first independent liberal arts institution dedicated specifically to serving

incarcerated students, has undergone a remarkable evolution. As part of its path to Initial Accreditation in 2022, the college strengthened its academic and operational foundations, including hiring key personnel, aligning learning outcomes, and launching its first computer lab within the facility. The accreditation process provided a framework that supported these efforts, helping the institution deepen its impact and expand student access to high-quality, college-level education, often for the first time.
