




Quantitative Underwater Ecological Surveying Techniques MSC280 - March 9-14, 2015

QUEST is a class that began at the University of Hawaii-Hilo in the early 1990s to train the future professionals in underwater surveying, fisheries, and other marine science careers.

To reach students in American Samoa, the American Samoa Community College and University of Hawaii Sea Grant College Program has offered an annual, snorkeling-based surveying course, also called QUEST since 2011. The next QUEST is planned to be held in Faga'alu Village during ASCC's Spring Break, March 9-14, 2015.

It is modeled after the successful University of Hawaii class and you will receive training to survey fish, seaweed, corals, and other invertebrates using snorkeling and scientific equipment.

Specialists from the National Park of American Samoa, the Department of Marine and Wildlife Resources, the American Samoa Community College, the National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration, the AS Department of Commerce and the University of Hawaii will lead students in lectures and on several snorkeling trips each day of QUEST.



All participants must present their student ID in order to participate for prizes. Sign up ahead of time with Kat in the SLA Center.


